Constituted in the Organized Reserve 15 October 1921 as the 25th Airdrome Company, assigned to the Second Army, and allotted to the Fifth Corps Area. Initiated in May 22 at Cleveland, OH. Redesignated on the 415th Airdrome Company 25 January 1923. Relocated 9 July 1931 to Columbus, OH. Redesignated on 415th Airdrome Squadron 1 October 1933. Relocated 21 December 1933 to Chillicothe, OH. Conducted annual summer training at Wright Field, OH. Consolidated on 28 November 1936 with the 415th Aero Squadron (Construction ) (a WWI unit organized in December 1917 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; redesignated as the 32nd Spruce Squadron July 1918; demobilized in January 1919 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; reconstituted on 28 November 1936). Inactivated by June 1937 at Chillicothe by relief of personnel. Status: Disbanded 31 May 42.
