EMBLEM

Tierced in pairle reversed azure, sable and celeste, a polar star above a southern cross or between flames gules fimbriated argent, all within a bordure gules. Below the emblem a scroll or bordered gules inscribed in capital letters sable. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the 416th Airborne Missile Maintenance Squadron. The light blue, blue and black background depicts the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, with the Polar Star and the Constellation Southern Cross indicating the unit's hemisphere-wide capability. The squadron's numerical designation 416 is referred to by the points of the stars. The flames symbolize the combustion in the propulsion chamber of a missile, explosive power and speed. The chevron represents the squadron's strength in support of the parent wing. The emblem bears the basic colors of the parent wing's emblem, light blue, blue and black, and the Air Force colors of gold and ultramarine blue. (Approved 11 Aug 1966)
