EMBLEM



On a brittany azure sky, an or winged caduceus extends from the middle chief to the middle base section of the disc. A gules cross bordered in argent is positioned at the sinister side of the disc, while three argent lightning bolts radiate from the caduceus on the dexter side. An ultramarine azure and sable globe extends from the dexter to the sinister side of the emblem and occupies all base points. An argent scroll is attached below. The scroll is inscribed with sable lettering which identifies the unit. The scroll and the disc are bordered in sable. Ultramarine and brittany blue are used in the design, symbolizing air force operations. The red cross is indicative of the geneva red cross formed to care for the sick and wounded in war, secure the neutrality of medical personnel and hospitals; and to help relieve suffering caused by natural disasters. The winged caduceus was chosen because of its relationship to ancient roman messengers. The caduceus was a sign of neutrality and established their neutral status. The caduceus is colored air force yellow to indicate the sun and the excellence required of air force personnel. The globe represents the unit's ability to deploy quickly. (Approved, 9 Aug 1988)
