MISSION

The 425th Air Base Squadron is a Geographically Separated Unit, or GSU, of the 39th Air Base Wing, Incirlik AB, Turkey. Squadron provides Provide medical, legal, logistics, communications, security forces, morale, services, financial and engineering support to U.S. personnel assigned to Component Command Headquarters Air Izmir and tenant organizations. Administer the \$1 million U.S.-Turkish Cigli AB Loan Agreement. The 425th ABS is composed of four flights: Logistics Flight, Security Forces Flight, Services and Communications, as well as a fully contracted civil engineering function. Approximately 105 U.S. Air Force military members are assigned to the air station. There are about 20 U.S. civilians, which includes government employees and contractors, and about 240 Turkish government and contracted employees.

EMBLEM



425th Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron emblem

425th Air Base Squadron emblem: On a disc per pale Azure and Argent, a knight upon his mount in armor counterchanged of the field, grasping in dexter hand a sword Or and in sinister hand an escutcheon blazoned Or, a polestar inverted per pale Azure and Argent; all within a narrow Blue border. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "ALLIANCE VALOR TRADITION" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "425TH AIR BASE SQUADRON" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The divided shield suggests day and night and reflects the twenty-four hour a day mission functions of the unit. The knight symbolizes the honor and integrity of the unit personnel. The shield and sword at ready represents the Squadron's support of the defense of the United States. The horse and rider at gallop reflect the unit's support to its wing and groups to ensure their ready response. (Approved, 28 Mar 1984; newest rendition approved, 13 Apr 1995)
