The 432nd FIS F-89 era was another Project Arrow transfer. On August 18,1955, the 432nd FIS designation was relocated from Truax AFB to Minneapolis-St. Paul IAP to replace the 337th FIS. The 432nd FIS had originally been activated at Truax to replace the 126th FIS of the Wisconsin ANG after their Korean Conflict activation had expired. Of late, they had been flying F-86Ds.

At Minneapolis-St. Paul IAP the 432nd FIS had twenty-two F-89Ds at the end of 1955 and began conversion to F-89Hs in early 1956, possessing twelve F-89Ds and thirteen F-89Hs by the end of June.
