432 Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, an eagle Sable fimbriated and detailed Argent, wings displayed, grasping in its beak three lightning bolts Or, perching on a sprocket of the third fimbriated of the second encircling in base a demi-globe Silver Gray gridlined White, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disk, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "432 MXS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force

yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning bolts represent the strike capability of USAF Air Power. The white sprocket is symbolic of the unit's ability to provide quality maintenance worldwide. The eagle, an astute hunter and bird of prey with keen eyesight, represents the Squadron's support of the Air Force global reach mission by maintaining vigilance, as symbolized by its presence over the globe.
