#### EMBLEM



434 Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron emblem: On an elliptical blue figure, bordered gold cross bands, a white chess knight formed by the head of a winged Pegasus, surrounded by eleven white stars, arranged four, three and four. (Approved, 10 Jul 1943)



On a disc Azure, a winged knight chess piece Argent, garnished Argent (Silver Gray), within eleven mullets of the second, four in dexter, four in sinister, three arched in chief, all encircled by an annulet, fretted at the directional points Or; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "IGNITE THE FIGHT" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "434TH FORCE SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The chess piece is comprised of a winged Pegasus which is symbolic of the members of the original armored air cavalry, Knights of the Air. The eleven white stars signify both the unit's designation number as well as the eleven primary functions of the Squadron: Civilian Personnel; Military Personnel; Administration; Force Development; Airman and Family Readiness; Food Service; Lodging; Fitness and Recreation; Mortuary; Readiness; and Honor Guard. The border of cross bands establishes the Squadron as the gold standard of Force Support units, providing superior, around-the-clock support to Airmen. (Approved, 19 Jan 2019)
