EMBLEM



439 Mission Support Squadron emblem: On a disc Sable, in front of an annulet barbed of three counter-clockwise at the three, twelve and nine positions Or, surmounted at base by a stylized aircraft fesswise reversed Vert, a pair of hands issuing from base holding a globe displaying the Western Hemisphere all Proper, all within a narrow border Red. Attached above the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "PRIDE" in Red letters. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "439TH MISSION SUPPORT SQ" in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The flight symbol with its navigation path alludes to the Squadron's support of flight, the Wing's primary mission. The hands supporting the world denote the support of the worldwide mission.
