The 442d Aircraft Maintenance Squadron emblem consists of three distinctive elements, each symbolizing a unique aspect of the squadron. The emblem consists of a bald eagle with a wrench in one talon and a generic shape bomb in the other, Air Force yellow lightning bolt and an Air Force blue background. SIGNIFICANCE: The bald eagle speaks to how we provide close air support and sense of comfort to our comrades on the ground. Like the bald eagle, we provide aircraft that attack their prey from the sky. The wrench clenched in the right talon symbolizes the hard work, dedication, and skill of all the maintainers in the squadron who work diligently and with tenacity to keep the aircraft in the skies. The generic shape bomb clenched in the left talon symbolizes the destruction and intimidating force we dispense upon those who oppose the United States. Like a bald eagle symbolizing freedom for the citizens of the United States, the eagle on this emblem is also representative of the freedom and safety we provide to our comrades on the ground; picking off our prey with precision and giving our troop "eyes in the sky." The Air Force yellow lightning bolt represents the rapidness and precision of our aircraft to the area of responsibility that we are often called to support. Moving at lightning speed, we are a destructive and turbulent force to our enemies. The third element, the Air Force blue background, symbolizes the sky in which our close air support missions take place; a hallmark of our squadron.
