EMBLEM



445 Air Base Group emblem: Azure, a sword argent (silver gray) handle, hilt, and pommell or, with a lightning flash gules, surmounted by a spade palewise of the second charged on the blade with a mullet of eight points radiant argent; overall in base a scroll of the like surmounted by a quill of the second feathered or; all within a diminished bordure of the like. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The scroll and the quill signify strength through knowledge, which is required in the administration of personnel, an essential element to effectively support a state of readiness. The sword and lightning bolt symbolize an effective deterrence maintained through communication. The spade with star represents the building of a safe future under the influence of experienced guidance. (Approved, 5 Nov 1987)
