OPERATIONS

The 452 Services Squadron Prime RIBS team spent a great deal of time over the past year supporting various activities. In the month of March, seven members deployed to Townsville, Australia in support of Tandem Thrust. While there , they supported the Royal Australian Air Force Food Service operation working in both a dining facility and Flight Kitchen. The training received was extremely valuable and gave our members the opportunity to work in a joint service mission. During this same frame, the members who remained here at March Field, supported the wing during the Quality Air Force Assessment (QAFA. The Prime RIBS team received and Excellent rating overall. Beginning in July, 16 members deployed to Spangdahlem AB, Germany for annual tour. The unit deployed in two separate two-week increments, supporting the host base active duty as they experience manpower shortages during the PCS season. Members supported Food Services, Lodging and Mortuary Services functions at the base. Many training objectives were met, as well as real world support provided. Due to a run

way closure, time was spent at both Spangdahlem and Bitburg AB providing flight kitchen support. Throughout the year members deployed to Georgia for Formal Field Certification Training for one week. While deployed to Dobbins ARE, members were certified in wartime operations, and received valuable hands on training in the areas of Food Service, Lodging, Command and Control, Laundry operations, and Tactical Field Exchange, as well as Force Beddown planning. The certification is good for two years.

In spite of the heavy global commitments, the unit kept very busy at March Field as well. The lodging; processes here at March Field received a lot of attention, resulting in changes to the process which have improved customer satisfaction and ease the amount of individuals required to report to the front desk to receive lodging accommodations on UTA's. In October, the men and women of the 452 SVF deployed to support the 452 CES with their annual bivouac. This tested the unit's ability to provide quality support in a field environment. Not resting on the laurels, an improved card reader-scanning; program was developed by CMS Borrero and Major Kendrik (452 MSS), to improve the time required to sign in for meals during UTA troop feeding. HQ AFRC noted the automatic meal card program's success during the QAFA, an looks forward to implementing the program command wide.

All the hard work did not go unnoticed by HQ AFRC. As a result of the unit's performance, unit members were called upon to support various Staff Assistance Visits and augment the AFRC IG team. SrA Stephanie Garcia received special recognition as the 1997 AFRC Service Military Technician award winner. In addition, she was also recognized by the Air Force for her hard work as a civilian at the March Inn, by receiving the coveted Travelers Award. She was presented her award in New York City. during an annual convention in November.
