#### **OPERATIONS**

In September 1941, the units which were to supervise the training arrived from Cochran Field, Ga. Those units, activated Aug. 1, were the 454th, 455th, 456th, 457th, and 458<sup>th</sup> School Squadrons later redesignated Basic Flying Training Squadrons.

An important organizational change took place here in 1944. The 454th, 455th, 456th, 457th, and 458th Basic Flying Training Squadrons were disbanded April 30, with all permanent party personnel being assigned to the 2142nd Army Air Forces Base Unit, which. became the principal unit on the base.
