### EMBLEM

On a disc Celeste, issuant from base a geodesic dome Azure, detailed and gridlined Argent, surmounted by a Corinthian column of the third detailed Sable, supporting a cross Gules, fimbriated of the fourth, charged with the rod of Asclepius Proper, all within a narrow bordure Blue. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "CREPIDOINIS PRO TUTELA" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "460TH MEDICAL SUPPORT SQUADRON" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The geodesic dome signifies the relationship to the mission of Air Force Space Command with its network of satellites and space-based operations. It also represents deployments and is the international symbol of medical care. The cross with the rod of Asclepius signifies the blood of life and is the international symbol of medical care. The column symbolizes the Squadron's dedication and steadfastness to its mission and creates the foundation for care. (Approved, 27 Sep 2010)
