EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, issuing from base a globe Vert, gridlined Argent, above an eagle Gules grasping in its talons three arrows radiating bendwise sinister, surmounting six rays radiating to chief and base Or, the latter terminating behind the globe, all within a narrow border Red. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "LEADING THE WAY" in Red letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "460TH OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle and arrows represent strength, vigilance and speed. The rays signify alertness skyward and earthbound, and indicate constancy, honor and the perfection of performance of duty. The earth represents the global operations of the unit and its objective of endeavoring peace.
