Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe symbolizes the totality of the Armed Forces and the solid ground, which the unit ensures for their support. The wings and star represent space and satellite communications. The lightning bolt and radio waves symbolize the communication abilities of the unit above and around the globe.
