On a disc Azure, an eagle Proper affronté wings displayed, between the wings five mullets arched three and two Or, the base embattled of three Sable, the center battlement cracked as a lightning flash of the field, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "461 OSS" in Black letters. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "461 OSS" in Black letters. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "EMITTE LUCEM ET VERITATEM" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle's commanding presence is unmatched and rules the skies through which it soars. It represents the Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System's (JSTARS) missions and the mission of the OSS with its sustained vision and vigilance. Long-term vision and support planning are the primary roles of the OSS. The five stars represent the squadrons to which the OSS provides continuous support.
