### EMBLEM



Celeste, a Mako shark naiant in base and reflexed to dexter dorsal Azure, ventral Argent fimbriated Sable mouth Gules below four arrows enarched bendwise in fess all radiating from the conjoined shafts at the shark's dorsal fin Or; all within a border per pale checky White and Black and Black. Attached above the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed 482d MAINTENANCE SQ in Black letters. Attached below the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed MAKO MAINTAINERS in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** 

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Mako shark represents the Squadron's mascot and signifies the aggressive approach to maintenance and safety. The checky border suggests" First In Maintenance ". The four streaming arrows allude to a long standing adage in the Wing: "Four in the Blue " (Approved, 14 Oct 1998)
