EMBLEM

In the lower portion of a Grotto blue disc, a demi-sphere with land areas Emerald Green and water blue, with white area in upper center. In the main portion of emblem, an Air Force blue

dragon with yellow and red eye and white wings detailed Air Force blue issuing from its back, wearing a green band that holds an open end wrench of white detailed Air Force blue and screw driver of white with the handle of Air Force yellow detailed Air Force blue and clutching two Air Force yellow projectiles. Issuing from the dragon's mouth two red lightning bolts all within a narrow white border edged Air Force blue. Below a blank white scrolled Air Force blue. SIGNIFICANCE: The demi-sphere represents the earth and the blue background, the sky. The dragon hovering over the land masses depicts its strength and the protective capabilities of the unit's deterrent force world-wide and the two projectiles signify the constant threat to the aggressor. The white wings allude to peace, with swiftness and performance of maintenance, the tools held in place by the green band showing the latter to be accomplished on the ground. The lightning bolts allude to the force which would be unleashed should world peace be compromised (Approved, 23 Apr 1964)
