Polaris, the guiding star and light, allude to Air Force Communications Command communicators who provide the medium for obtaining and providing guidance to all Air Force activities through communications systems. The star also symbolizes the NATO mission, thus, the close coordination with our Allies. The ellipses signify the elements of the atom, the basis of all electronic/electrical equipment that the 2161st Communication Squadron operates and maintains. This is the macrocosm view. In the macrocosm, the ellipses represent the earth and the global-wide communications (connectivity) which the 2161st Communications Squadron provides. The lightning bolt indicates the transmission and reception of signals by the communications equipment and is symbolic of Air Force Communications Command. Peterson Opens Renovated Network Operations Center The 561st Network Operations Squadron at Peterson AFB, Colo., officially opened the doors to its new operations center this week after a \$4.5 million renovation. The new operations center, dubbed the "bullpen," is designed like a Wall Street trading floor, complete with a 70-foot data wall that "enables the squadron to have direct visual contact to other squadrons with similar missions," according to an April 30 release. Lt. Col. Roy Rockwell, 561st NOS commander, said the new design streamlines communication and simplifies the decision-making process. "A professional organization needs a professional environment to work in," said Rockwell. "This ceremony is a small example of how far cyberspace

operations have come. We have made large steps in a short amount of time." When the squadron first began operations in 2007, there were just 10 military members conducting cyberspace operations. Today, there are more than 560 Active Duty, Reserve, civilian, and contractors working 24 hours a day, states the release. The center is expected to advance overall command and control of USAF network communications by "providing enhanced situational awareness and command and control capabilities" and increasing "cyber crew commander and cyber operations controller influence of situations," states the release. 2014
