## **OPERATIONS**

2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group mission was the worldwide delivery of United States Air Force, Military Assistance Program and Foreign Military Sales aircraft and provide air transportation for continental United States armies.

2<sup>nd</sup> Ferry Group was redesignated and activated as 2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group 15 Oct 1965 deriving mission, personnel and equipment from 4440<sup>th</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group.

In 1976, 2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group's primary sorties were: Coronet East (Atlantic, European, Middle East), Coronet West (Pacific And East Asian Areas), Coronet North (Alaskan and Canadian Area), and Coronet South (Caribbean And South American Area). Supported Tac Project Coronet Cove deployment A-7's to and from Howard Air Force Base, Canal Zone. Group's first deliveries of controlled move of YC-15s. Group also delivered RF-4Es to Iran, part of Project Peace Roll III.

In 1984, 2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group supported 18 tactical air command deployments by providing either operational control, movement control, team assistance, or both. Deployments were: Brim Frost 83, Coronet Armor, Coronet Banner, Coronet Castle, Coronet Cove, Coronet Cross, Coronet Dagger, Coronet Joust, Coronet Lance, Coronet Shield, Coronet Squire, Kindle Liberty 83, Opportune Journey, Salty Bee 83, Sentry Tigre, Trial Embowi, And Universal Trek.

2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group delivered 82 aircraft of four different types (F-4, F-15, F-16, F-111) to foreign governments under seven separate foreign military sale: Peace Vector, Project Hill, Peace Sun, Fms Germany, Peace Gate, Peace Land And Peace Eagle.

On 1 Jun 1983, 2<sup>nd</sup> Aircraft Delivery Group implemented its system to transmit automatically to its 11 Detachments a complete computer flight plan in pilots' log format.

Members of the group experienced problems with F-100 Pratt-Whitney engines on F-15 and F-16 aircraft during delivery missions.
