MISSION

Third Air Force exercises delegated authorities over assigned forces that include personnel management, General Courts Martial Convening Authority, and advising subordinate commands on requirements, programs and budget. Third Air Force also works with its subordinate commands to ensure implementation and compliance with relevant policies and directives. Additionally, Third Air Force facilitates coordination between its subordinate commands and USAFE-AFAFRICA, USEUCOM, USAFRICOM, DOD agencies, and other field activities.

As U.S. Air Forces in Europe and Air Forces Africa's only numbered air force, the NAF's 28member, command staff provides support for all of Third Air Force, which consists of 10 wings with more than 32,000 Airmen across two continents -- an area-of-responsibility that stretches from the Arctic to the Cape of Good Hope.

Airmen and their families are our greatest resource, and we take deliberate actions to develop them as a group and as individuals. We are focused on confronting global challenges in support of the National Defense Strategy to defend our country and our allies. Through our dedicated efforts, we will deliver peace to our nation and its allies by fostering stability and deterring aggression throughout Europe and Africa.

EMBLEM



On and over a blue disc within a yellow border an Arabic numeral "3" in white, in bend sinister, shaded in red perspective with a white star charged with a red disc in the lower loop. The winged star is symbolic of the Army Air Forces and the Arabic numeral "3" indicates the unit's numerical designation. (Approved, 1 Sep 1943; revised, 8 Dec 1953 and, 13 May 1996)

OPERATIONS

One of the original four numbered air forces formed in the United States in 1940, primarily trained units, crews, and individuals for bombardment, fighter, and reconnaissance operations. Also had air defense responsibilities and some units engaged in antisubmarine efforts from Dec 1941-Oct 1942. Following WWII, assigned to Tactical Air Command to serve as a troop carrier organization until Nov 1946.

Beginning in May 1951, responsible for U.S. Air Forces in Europe (USAFE) bases and units in the United Kingdom; conducted training and operations in support of NATO. From the early 1990s until 2005, Third Air Force served as USAFE's primary humanitarian command element and was involved in several operations in sub-Saharan Africa and the Balkans; also given responsibility in

1996 for all USAFE units north of the Alps and expanded duties in Eastern Europe and Africa. Beginning in Dec 2006, assumed role as warfighting headquarters component for air forces in Europe.
