EMBLEM





The unit officially adopted Cupid from Walt Disney's Fantasia as their emblem in June 1943. Cupid, jotting down the weather forecast while sitting on a cloud between the sun and rain is wearing a "Sherlock Holmes" hat, symbolizing the unit's mission of weather investigation and prediction. This emblem was designed by the Walt Disney Company and was licensed to the U.S. Government on 15 April 1943 for the sum of one dollar, and it remains today as it was originally designed.
