Constituted in the Regular Army on 1 September 1936, assigned to the General Headquarters Air Force, and allotted to the Seventh Corps Area. Concurrently organized at Sherman Field, Fort Leavenworth, KS, with personnel from the Air Corps Detachment, Fort Leavenworth. The squadron was responsible for maintaining the flight facilities and aircraft at Sherman Field. It also provided various types of aircraft for the flight-rated officers and students of the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth to maintain their flying skills
