EMBLEM

On an ultramarine azure disc. A gules sun is placed at chief. Or rays emanate from the sun and illuminate all positions on the disc an argent sword is hung from the sun and balanced by three sable lines an argent eagle with wings displayed grasps the sword with its talons at the fess point. An argent scroll is positioned below the sword at middle chief. The disc is bordered with ultramarine blue. An argent scroll is attached below the disc the scroll. Which is blank. Is also bordered with ultramarine blue. **SIGNIFIANCE:** Ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design blue represents the sky. The primary theater of Air Force operations yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel the red sun symbolizes the power source from which we gain our strength. The yellow light of the sun also represents the light of protection that the 4 LSS provides to the overall mission. The silver eagle symbolizes the freedom we fight to preserve. The sword symbolizes the readiness of forces we are willing to use in defense of our country the scroll inscribes our declaration of support to those who rely on our services
