## **OPERATIONS**

Group consisted of Group Hq & Hq Sq, 10th Depot Repair Sq and the 10th Depot Supply Sq.

The 10th Air Depot Gp was constituted 30 Dec 1941 and activated at Patterson Fld OH 5 Jan 1942. It departed for the UK in Jul 1942 and was at Burtonwood, England until Dec 1942. It was subsequently stationed at Poynton, Wattisham, Zeals, and Chilbolton in the UK. It moved to the continent in 1944 and was stationed at Villacoublay, France and Charleroi, Belgium and in Apr 1945 moved into Germany, where it was first stationed at Kassel. It remained in Germany with the occupation forces, and a year later moved to the Ansbach Air Depot, where it was redesignated the 10th Air Depot around 1 Jun 1946. In Dec 1946, it moved to the Oberpfaffenhofen Air Depot. On 1 Jul 1948 it returned to the US and Robins AFB GA, where it was inactivated 17 Oct 1948. It was disbanded 17 Sep 1984.
