OPERATIONS

12th Civil Engineering Squadron began operations at Cam Ranh Bay on August 1965, when the first Air Force advance party arrived from McDill AFB, Florida, to begin construction of what was to eventually become Cam Ranh Bay Air Base.

In October 1965, the first aircraft touched down, and in the ensuing months of the first year over 20,000 F-4C sorties were flown. The following October, 8,000 feet of concrete runway opened, thus allowing larger aircraft to use Cam Ranh Bay AB, Meanwhile, the 12 CES had continued to develop base facilities, including billeting, office, hanger and shop structures.
