The AMC discontinued the 2949th Support Group and in its place activated the 25th Ammunition Supply Squadron, reorganized and attached it to the 2849th Air Base Wing, Hill AFB and concurrently inactivated the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron. 18 NOV 1957

The 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron moved from Kelly Air Force Base, Texas to Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado. 1 MAR 1950

AMC discontinued the 2949th Support Group at Hill AFB; inactivated the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron, assigning its personnel and equipment to the reorganized 25th Ammunition

Supply Squadron with its Table of Organization strength of 10 officers, 237 airmen. 8 NOV 1957

AMC transferred the 2949th Support Group with its 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons to Hill AFB from Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah. 1 AUG 1955

AMC redesignated the 25th, 29th and 30th Ammunition Supply Squadrons as Supply Squadrons (Depot). 1 NOV 1954

The 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron moved from the Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado to the Tooele Ordnance Depot, still under Ogden's administrative control. 25 APR 1953

The AMC discontinued the 2949th Support Group and in its place activated the 25th Ammunition Supply Squadron, reorganized and attached it to the 2849th Air Base Wing, Hill AFB and concurrently inactivated the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron. 18 Nov 1957

The 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron moved from Kelly Air Force Base, Texas to Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado. 1 MAR 1960

10 Nov 1951 When AMC inactivated the 29th Air Depot Wing at SBAMA on this date it assigned the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron of the Wing to Ogden, leaving it stationed at Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado. It had moved to Pueblo from Headquarters, SAAMA, Kelly AFB, Texas, on 28 February 1950.

25 Jun 1953 AMC transferred the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron from Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado to the Tooele Ordnance Depot.

1 Aug 1955 AMC moved the 2949th Support Group with its 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons from Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah to Hill AFB.

Now AMC brought its ammunition outfits to Hill AFB. On 1 August 1955 it moved the 2949th Support Group, with its 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons, stationed at the Army's Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah, to Hill. The 30th Ammunition Supply Squadron was a part of the 2949th until 8 May 1955 when AMC activated it, transferred 17 of its 44 personnel to overseas ammunition organizations and the remainder to bolster the 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons.

In a consolidation move, effective 18 November 1957, AMC discontinued the 2949th Support Group at Hill AFB, concurrently inactivating its 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron (Depot). Surplus personnel, where practical, then became a part of the redesignated and reorganized 25th Ammunition Supply Squadron (Depot), which became the only ammunition supply operation under Ogden following the above date. Military strength of the 25th, authorized on 18 November, was 10 officers and 237 airmen. By 31 December 1957 the actual assigned strength was 18 officers and 194 airmen. Assisting the ammunition supply squadron in the ammunition-EOD mission was the 2700th EOD Squadron and its 12 officers and 70 airmen assigned and 13 officers and 122 airmen authorized (this included personnel at Hill AFB and in nine detachments — no separate figures

available), effective 18 November 1957.

The 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron moved from Kelly Air Force Base, Texas to Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado., 1 Mar 1950

10 Nov 1951, Concurrently with the inactivation of the 29th Air Depot Wing at San Bernardino AMA, the USAF assigned the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron to Ogden AMA, leaving it stationed at Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado. Its four officers and 146 airmen moved from Kelly AFB, Texas to Pueblo on 1 March 1950.

The 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron moved from the Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado to the Tooele Ordnance Depot, still under Ogden's administrative control. 25 Jun 1953

AMC transferred the 2949th Support Group with its 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons to Hill AFB from Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah. 1 Aug 1955

AMC discontinued the 2949th Support Group at Hill AFB; inactivated the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron, assigning its personnel and equipment to the reorganized 25th Ammunition Supply Squadron with its Table of Organization strength of 10 officers, 237 airmen., 18 Nov 1957

On the date AMC inactivated the 29th Air Depot Wing at San Bernardino AMA, 10 November 1951, it assigned the 29th Ammunition Supply Squadron (of that wing) to Ogden, leaving it stationed at Pueblo Ordnance Depot, Pueblo, Colorado. Its four officers and 146 airmen moved from Kelly AFB, Texas on 1 March 1950. Its seven officers and 172 airmen moved to the Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah on 25 June 1953.

Now AMC brought its ammunition outfits to Hill AFB. On 1 August 1955 it moved the 2949th Support Group, with its 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons, stationed at the Army's Tooele Ordnance Depot, Tooele, Utah, to Hill. The 30th Ammunition Supply Squadron was a part of the 2949th until 8 May 1955 when AMC activated it, transferred 17 of its 44 personnel to overseas ammunition organizations and the remainder to bolster the 25th and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons.

Ogden's new staff element, the Air Force Ammunition Services Office (OOR) began its full-fledged operations soon after decentralization of functions from AMC on 28 November 1955. Ammunition, explosive materiel surveillance and safety were part of its mission. Assisting it in the new AF-wide mission were these military outfits: 2949th Support Group (18 officers and airmen), with its 25th (153 officers and airmen) and 29th Ammunition Supply Squadrons (144 officers and airmen) stationed at Hill AFB. In addition was the 2700th EOD Squadron headquartered at Hill AFB together with its Detachment 3. As of 31 December 1955 EOD strength at Hill AFB was three officers and eight airmen with 14 officers and 68 airmen in nine outlying Detachments (shown above with assignment data). The 2700th was under the technical direction of the Chief of the AF Ammunition Services Office, but operated as a separate squadron under the operational control of the OOAMA Commander.
