EMBLEM

The stylized fighting rack symbolizes the mission of the 31st Weather Squadron not only as providing weather support on an everyday basis (the familiar weather vane rooster) but also the maintaining of wartime capability (the warrior attire). The shield he carries indicates his allegiance to the Air Weather Service and support and attachment to the U.S. Air Forces,

Europe. The weather vane is superimposed on a background of cumulonimbus or thunderhead cloud to indicate his activity during periods of bad weather. The Air Force colors of ultramarine blue and golden yellow, as well as the national colors of red, white, and blue are used. (Approved, 16 Mar 1959)
