EMBLEM

Against a background divided into three parts, blue representing daytime operations, black representing night operations, and golden yellow symbolizing the golden opportunities in future operations, an anemometer indicates the Air Weather Service. The cumulonimbus cloud emitting a lightning flash represents the unit's foul weather alertness, the manned fighter aircraft and the unmanned missile indicate the type of mission supported, and the Mastiff taken from the emblem of the 32nd Air Division represents its support to that division. The emblem bears the Air Force colors of ultramarine blue and golden yellow and the national colors of red, white, and blue. (Approved, 6 June 1962)
