A C-130 assigned to the 34th TATG, 34th TTS at Little Rock Air Force Base crashed three miles short of the runway at Greenville, Mississippi on June 8, 1988. The aircraft had been making touch-and-go training landings at the airstrip when a student pilot lost control. Killed in the accident were 2nd Lieutenant Thomas D. Leece, 2nd Lieutenant Mark R. Brandt, and Staff Sergeant David S. Bingham of the 34th TAS, and three student pilots. The accident was attributed to pilot error, though long duty hours and pilot fatigue were determined to have

been contributing factors.
