EMBLEM

On a green disc, resting on a horizontally draped black chain, a yellow stylized demi-tiger detailed black, eyes and mouth red, teeth and claws white, grasping a blue loading hook garnished yellow and black; all within a narrow blue border. Attached below the disc a white scroll bordered blue and attached above the disc a white scroll bordered blue inscribed "Manna from Heaven" in blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The tiger was the WW II mascot of the 3rd Air Cargo Resupply Detachment. The chain links the new 35th with the historic 3rd ACRD. The loading hook symbolizes the role of the Squadron in the USAFR mission; (Approved, 12 Dec 1984)
