#### **OPERATIONS**

The First Provisional Training Wing became the 38th Flying Training Wing on January 8, 1943. This, the first of the flying training wings to be organized in the AAF, was established October

17, 1942 with headquarters in the City Hall of Roswell, New Mexico. On September 10 1943, the headquarters of the 38<sup>th</sup> Flying Training Wing was moved from Roswell to Kirtland Field, Albuquerque. New Mexico.

The 38th Flying Training Wing has supervision over the Army Air Fields located at Albuquerque, Carlsbad, Deming, Ft. Sumner, Hobbs, and Roswell in New Mexico; La Junta in Colorado; and Pecos and Marfa in Texas.

Head of the wing since its inception 11 October 17, 1942, has been Brigadier General Martin F. Scanlon.
