Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "48TH EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE SQ" in Blue letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The silver wrench represents the superior maintenance mission and performance of the unit. The buff hand symbolizes strength and dexterity in the performance of mechanical duties. The black background signifies the ability to fulfill the air mission.
