OPERATIONS

Activated early in 1958, the 4238th Strategic Wing has the responsibility for overall operation of the base, and direct control over the tactical units based here. Tactical units assigned to the 4238th are the 436th Bomb Squadron equipped with the B-52; the 913th Air Refueling Squadron, flying KC-135s; and the 301st and 376th Air Refueling Squadrons, both equipped with the KC-97. In addition, the air base group and specialized maintenance squadrons are assigned to the wing. Primary mission of the 4238th is threefold. First, it must be capable of conducting long range operations on any part of the globe, at any time, independently or in cooperation with land and sea forces. Secondly, it must be able to provide combat units capable of sustained and intense combat operations in all parts of the world. Finally, it must train strategic bombardment and refueling crews and units for the performance of such global operations.

4238 Strategic Wing (Sw) Had 16 B-52f Bomber Aircraft And 20 Kc-135a Tanker Aircraft. 1963

The introduction of these new aircraft initiated a wave of reorganization activity within Second Air Force. Barksdale was especially active in this reorganization. Effective March 1, 1958, the 4238th Strategic Wing (B-52 and KC-135) was designated and organized at Barksdale Air Force Base. This new wing was assigned to the 4th Air Division, stationed at Barksdale.

The organizational structure of the new wing included its headquarters squadron, the 4238th Periodic Maintenance Squadron, 4238th Field Maintenance Squadron, and the 4238th Armament Electronics Maintenance Squadron.

On 1 March, 1958, Barksdale's 301st Air Refueling Squadron was transferred to the 4238th Strategic Wing. This gave the newly organized wing two combat - ready tanker squadrons.

On April 1, 1963, the 4238th Strategic Wing and its associated support squadrons were deactivated at Barksdale. The 436th Bombardment Wing was also deactivated. All of the personnel equipment and aircraft of the deactivated units were absorbed by the newly arrived 2nd Bombardment Wing. With the deactivation of the 4238th, Barksdale's remaining tactical units were the 2nd Bombardment Wing, the 20th Bombardment Squadron, and the 913th Air Refueling Squadron.

In March, the 4238th Strategic Wing, flying B-52s and KC-135s, was designated and organized at Barksdale AFB. The wing was assigned to the 4th Air Division. On April 15, 1958, the 30lst Bombardment Wing moved from Barksdale AFB, and the base's 805th Air Base Group was inactivated and replaced by the 4238th Air Base Group. In August 1958, the 436th Heavy Bombardment Squadron (B-52) moved to Barksdale AFB from Carswell AFB, and was assigned to the 4238th Strategic Wing.
