EMBLEM

On a disc divided per bend black and Air Force Yellow, an Air Force blue bend wavy, fimbriated Air Force yellow against the black. On the upper portion a white winged torch enflamed red, fimbriated yellow, the torch entwined by a green serpent; on the bottom portion, a red cross, the disc within an Air Force yellow border. Attached below the disc a blank white scroll edged Air Force yellow. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the Hospital. The Staff of Aesculapius is representative of the Air Force medical service and with the red cross, international symbol of mercy, indicates the unit's mission. The yellow background symbolizing ripened rice and the bar wavy (heraldic symbol for water) denote the unit's overseas service in Southeast Asia. The black background symbolizes night and death; also, the night missions of the Southeast Asia base to which the unit was attached. The emblem bears the Air Force colors golden yellow and ultramarine blue. (Approved, 19 Jul 1967)
