Azure, a Pegasus forcene Or garnished Brown between three clouds Argent garnished Celeste issuing from the edges all within a diminished bordure White; all within a diminished bordure Gules. Attached below the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed 11 76t h AIR REFUELING SQ II in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Pegasus represents the swift air

refueling capabilities of the unit as it completes the Air Force global reach mission. (Approved: 17 Apr 1996, superseding emblem approved 30 Mar 1944.)
