MISSION

The 76th Commodities Maintenance Group delivers unparalleled support to the warfighter, producing one item every minute in support of Air Force, Army and Navy missions. 76 CMXG shoulders the critical responsibility of inspecting, repairing and testing 3500 types of end items and 400 different secondary structures for jet engines, aircraft and cruise missiles. 76 CMXG delivers engine components for fuel systems, oil systems, electronics systems and hydraulic systems, including main bearings, oil pumps, fuel pumps, main fuel controls, afterburner fuel controls, fuel nozzles and afterburner fuel nozzles, electrical cables, exciter boxes, generators and spark plugs. In addition, 76 CMXG repairs avionics, flight controls, cowlings, constant speed drives, hatches, refueling booms, nose cones, radomes, horizontal stabilizers and breathable oxygen systems in support of B- 1, B-52, E-3, E-6 and KC-135 weapon systems.

The 76th Commodities Maintenance Group (CMXG) is comprised of three squadrons that support co-located engine and aircraft maintenance production lines as well as area base tenants. Signature capabilities for the group include repair, overhaul, test, manufacture, machining and engineering processes. Situated throughout 23 buildings with 1.57M sq ft of production space, CMXG employees over 1900 highly trained professionals with experience in 54 different job series. The Group repairs and/or overhauls over 3500 types of end items and 400 different secondary structures. CMXG is the most diverse group within the 76 Maintenance Wing.
