## **EMBLEM**

On an ultramarine blue disc, a light blue (Brittany) globe grid lined ultramarine blue charged with a red heart emitting three red elliptical orbit trails arcing behind the globe and each ending with a white flight symbol on the globe. All between seven white pole stars in dexter

chief and seven white pole stars in sinister; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc an ultramarine blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border and attached below the disc an ultramarine blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border and inscribed DUTY FROM THE HEART in yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The stars, representing the seven continents and the seven seas, allude to the squadron's global mission. The heart reflects the motto of the unit. (Approved, 16 Mar 1988)
