EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, five flight symbols (Delta Wings) with contrails throughout per bendwise sinister, flight symbol Black and contrails Argent (Silver Gray) over a red cross touching each Delta Wing, all over three latitude yellow lines North, three latitude yellow lines South, three longitude yellow lines East and three longitude yellow lines West, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "78TH MEDICAL OPERATIONS SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "PRAESTANTES OPS CURARE" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The five flight symbols (Delta Wings) and contrails pertain to the five combatant commands; PACOM, SOUTHCOM, AFRICOM, EUCOM, and CENTCOM where Airmen deploy to defend our nation. The red cross represents the medical care delivered to Airmen in support of the mission. The globe represents the expeditionary nature of our mission. Each of the three latitude and longitude yellow lines in the North, South, East, and West represent the corps values (Integrity, Service, and Excellence) accompanying each Airmen to all four corners of the globe.
