EMBLEM

4484 Test Squadron emblem: On a disc divided bend sinisterwise nebuly blue and red a white polestar between two white stars on the blue and on the red a yellow lightning flash detailed black issuing from the sinister side converging at center with a black flight symbol detailed white emitting a yellow arced contrail issuing from base all within a narrow white border. Attached below the disc a blank yellow scroll bordered white. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The blue field signifies the sky, the Air Force theater of operations and the over-water range where operational testing is conducted. The red part of the field symbolizes the courage and determination necessary to carry out the mission. Yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The aircraft symbol represents the flight testing of the Squadron. The lightning bolt Indicates the squadron's involvement with aircraft instrumentation, radar development and electronic

warfare. The stars refer to the planning, testing, and evaluation functions of the squadron. (Approved, 11 Jul 1984)



On a disc per bend nebuly Azure and Gules, a Polestar in dexter flanked by two mullets Argent; from sinister a lightning bolt Or fimbriated Sable, arching from sinister base to nombril a stylized aircraft of the last, edged of the third, contrail of the fourth, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disk, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "84TH TEST & EVAL SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background signifies the over-water range where operational testing is conducted, as well as the courage and determination necessary to carry out the mission. The aircraft symbol represents the flight testing of the Squadron. The lightning bolt indicates the unit's involvement with aircraft instrumentation, radar development, and electronic warfare. The stars refer to the planning, testing and evaluation functions of the Squadron. (Approved, 11 Jul 1984)
