EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, on a pile Or three piles reversed chevronwise Argent, barbed with as many flight symbols at the points Gules, between a dexter cubit arm issuant from dexter and a sinister cubit arm issuant from sinister Proper, supporting in base the silhouette of a hum family of three male, child and female Sable, debruised by a mullet of the Second, all within a diminished bordure of the like. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "88TH MISSION SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MISSION FIRST PEOPLE ALWAYS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The pile shape is symbolic of the support provided by the unit to the Air Force. The flight symbols allude to the unit's dedication to their mission. The two hands symbolize the unit's support of both the family and the Air Force. The star symbolizes the Squadron's unity with the Air Force in defending the peace. (Approved, 30 Aug 2000)
