EMBLEM

90 Field Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a scarlet and black checky disc, a yellow 'war bird" (resembling a pterodactyl) wings displayed riding a white missile bendwise issuing scarlet and yellow flames; all within a narrow blue inner border and a narrow yellow outer border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The missile signifies the maintenance mission of the unit. The yellow "war bird." from the emblem of the 90th Strategic Missile Wing, indicates the unit's link to the wing. The red and black checkerboard reflects the strong and consistent strategic posture maintained by the ICBM systems--the Minuteman and the Peacekeeper. (Approved, 14 Oct 1988)
