

**EMBLEM** 



On an ultramarine blue disc grid lined white, a bald eagle proper in flight grasping a black net and pallet containing a silver gray crate; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a white scroll edged with a narrow yellow border inscribed WE STAND READY in blue letters. Attached below the disc a white scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe symbolizes the worldwide transportation of goods and parts which make the military mission of the United States attainable. The Aer ia1 Port Squadron system is the backbone of the airlift delivery network. The net and crate reflect the mission of the Aerial Port Squadrons--that of putting the cargo loads into workable delivery units; assembling the loads under multiple priority systems; making up the load units; storing, transporting, and loading cargo; and certifying it for flight safety. The motto indicates the willingness of the unit to serve the global transportation system of the Military Airlift Command in the Ready Reserve.
