On a disc Azure, a sphere Vert, gridlined of the field, voluted with a gear wheel of twelve teeth Sable, and charged with a flight symbol ascending bendwise Or, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "EXCELLENCE ABOVE ALL" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "94TH AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE SQ" in Black letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel.
