EMBLEM


On a disc Azure, entwining a compass rose, an annulet Or with four main points of the compass counterchanged Sable, surmounted by a hurt bordered of the last, overall a panther crouched affronté Proper, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "TRAIN LOCALLY EXECUTE GLOBALLY" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "94TH LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFIANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The panther represents the Squadron's link with the 94th Airlift Wing's "Panthello." The compass rose

symbolizes global logistics to support transportation, supply or planning anywhere in the world. The motto, "Train Locally Execute Globally," signifies the Squadron is a reserve unit that trains at home to deploy anywhere in the world to execute the Air Force mission.
