#### **OPERATIONS**

The 97th wing's units entered combat in early 1944, bombing oil refineries, marshalling yards, steel plants, and tank factories plus numerous other assorted targets in the European theater. In Sep 1944, some of the units ceased Bombardment missions and instead flew gasoline for Army units to airfields in France. Others air-dropped supplies to Allied troops during the airborne attack on Holland that same month. During the Battle of the Bulge, Dec 1944 Jan 1945, subordinate units of the 97th aided Allied ground forces by bombing German transportation lines. Besides strategic Bombardment, they also dropped supplies to Allied troops during the airborne assault across the Rhine River in Mar 1945. Active in the Reserve, Jun 1947-Jun 1949, the organization was redesignated as a division in Apr 1948.
