MISSION

Provides, operates, and maintains advanced communication and information management systems, air traffic control systems, navigational aids, mobile radios, telephone operations, and base-wide communications, and computer network control. Conducts infrastructure planning, visual information support, and communications and information security programs.

The squadron has since developed the vision of "Providing outstanding support as the single point of contact for focused communications and information technology planning, implementation, maintenance and support" and its motto, "Comm check...loud and clear!" The squadron's goal is to "Provide reliable and responsive communications and information technology and combat capability for the nation."

The squadron is organized into three flights, each with a distinct set of key, core responsibilities:

The Mission Systems Flight which is responsible for maintaining all airfield radar systems, base meteorological and navigational control systems, ground-to-air and land mobile radios, Next Generation Weather Radar. In addition the flight supports telephone and cable plan maintenance along with telephone operations.

The Plans Flight provides management, planning and implementation of the base communications and information systems infrastructure blueprint. The flight also manages the squadron's \$1.8 million budget and the unit's deployment taskings.

Information Systems Flight manages all communications and information systems maintenance,

information assurance, defense messaging system support, local area network support, small computer systems maintenance, long-haul communications circuits, computer equipment control, administrative communications through the official mail center, records management of Privacy Act and Freedom of Information Act material, wing-wide publications and forms management and multi-media support.

EMBLEM



Two shades of blue around the globe symbolize day and night service. A single four-point star symbolizes navigational aid service to aircraft. Five pointed stars symbolize the five major sections of the squadron. The tower with radiating lightning around the globe symbolizes worldwide communications. The antenna on the tower with radiating lines symbolizes air traffic control to aircraft.

An Ultramarine Blue and Brittany Azure globe is positioned on its axis at the honor point on an Ultramarine Azure disc. The globe is highlighted with Yellow Or longitude and latitude lines. A cougar is perched atop the globe at middle chief. An Air Force Or satellite orbits the globe. Sable highlights from the cougar's rapid paw movement and the orbiting of the star illuminate the globe slightly Dexter of the nombril point. An Ultramarine Azure scroll is attached above and below the disc. The scroll above bears the units designation, "97 COMMUNICATIONS SQ," and the one below displays the motto, "IN OMINIA PARATUS." **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are used in the design; Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The world map alludes to the unit's global response in performance of its mission. The cougar symbolizes unit's fearless pursuit of its mission while the Yellow star denotes the squadron's universal reach in performance of its duties. All elements reflect the unit's motto, "IN OMNIA, PARATUS"

MOTTO

IN OMNIA, PARATUS-Prepared in All Things

In 1996, the 97 Communications Squadron developed its unit mascot, a cougar, and at the same time adopted the Latin motto, "In Omnia Paratus," which translates to "Prepared for All Things." As a result of adopting the two elements, the squadron obtained approval for a new squadron shield in November 1997. The shield highlights the new mascot and fearless pursuit of mission goals.
