MISSION

The squadron is comprised of 30 military and civilians, providing world-class decision support to wing leaders and financial services to individuals. To perform these missions, the squadron is comprised of two flights, Financial Analysis and Financial Services.

The Financial Analysis Flight is responsible for all facets of managing budgetary and accounting resources in support of the wing's mission. The flight assists leaders with timely and relevant financial advice for estimating program requirements and translating those requirements into budget execution plans and operating budgets. The flight also provides cost validation of proposed ideas and alternatives to meet mission objectives. Finally, the flight uses traditional and innovative resourcing to support wing priorities while ensuring internal controls are in place to conform to federal laws for expenditure of funds. In addition to its budgetary function, the flight is the interface between local customers, both individuals and businesses, and the Defense Accounting and Finance Service. They certify funding is available before contracts are awarded and ensure payments are documented and processed appropriately.

The Financial Services Flight handles military and civilian pay issues, retirement and savings programs, debt collections, travel entitlements and other individual financial calculations for all Department of Defense personnel assigned to units on Altus Air Force Base, as well as military retirees in the area.

Finally, the squadron leadership staff oversees internal processes. The Quality Assurance Monitor tracks performance of other sections within the squadron in order to evaluate the quality of support provided to customers. The Non-Appropriated Funds Analyst functions much like a financial consultant and accountant for the base activities which must be self supporting, such as the bowling

center. All function together to provide world-class support.
