EMBLEM

Azure, a bend indented between a dexter mailed hand couped at the wrist bendwise, grasping a drop bomb and an olive wreath, all Or, all within a diminished bordure of the last. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "98TH AIR BASE GROUP" in Blue letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The olive wreath is a symbol of peace, and the mailed hand shows preparedness, separated by an indented bend representing the speed

at which the organization will adapt itself to either.
