Anticipating the squadron's return, The Adjutant General created the 8133d Squadron in mid-1952, with Lieutenant Colonel William J. Hamilton as interim commander, to provide a "holding" unit into which new airmen could be enlisted to await the return of the 133d from active duty and the certain loss of experienced personnel. The widely scattered 160 New Hampshire Air Guardsmen began returning to their homes a few months later and, on 1

November 1952, the colors of the 133d Fighter Squadron were officially returned to the State and the unit, equipped with P-51H, resumed its peacetime mission.

The 8133d Squadron was disbanded and its personnel merged into the 133d Squadron and on 11 January 1953,
